

The Rabeh's Main Palace

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The Rabeh's Main Palace is a single, two-storey, building with two great halls on the ground floor. Rabih Al-Zubair Fadr Al-lah held court in the first hall, while the second adjacent hall was used by the *Ulamas* (Islamic scholars) for reciting the Holy Quran 24/7.

German Colonial Residence

The German Colonial Residence (GCR) building is built of burnt bricks and adhered by limestone cement plaster. It was built in 1893, the classic colonial style of the era with deep colonnaded verandahs.

The Armory

The Armory is the single room at the front, serving the dual purpose of a traditional reception area and an armory (store) where weapons and ammunition are kept.
